Admission

Minimum Age: Kindergarten or First Grade

To be eligible for enrollment in kindergarten at the beginning of the school year or at any later time in the same year, a child must have his/her fifth birthday on or before December 2 of the current school year. To be eligible for enrollment in first grade, a child must have his/her sixth birthday on or before December 2 of the current school year.

Evidence of Age

Legal evidence of a child's age is required for admission. The legal evidences of age, in order of preference, are as follows:

1. Certificate of birth
2. Baptismal certificate
3. Passport
4. Immigration certificate
5. Bible record
6. Affidavit of parent

Students Coming From a School Outside the District

Students who arrive as transfer students from other kindergarten programs and who have been legally and continuously enrolled in private or public kindergartens in the State of California shall be admitted to the kindergarten program if the child was enrolled according to the birthday requirement above.

A child who, according to the birthday requirement above, has been admitted to a kindergarten maintained by a private or public school in California or any other state, and who has completed one school year therein, will be given credit for the enrollment and placed in the first grade.
