Submit your FAFSA or California Dream Act application between October 1, 2019 and March 2, 2020. Submit your GPA to be considered for a Cal Grant and other aid even if you are not sure which college you will attend.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE CASH FOR COLLEGE WORKSHOP:

- Student's and parents' Social Security numbers (if applicable)
- Student's and parents' 2018 completed federal income tax return including W2s. If not completed yet, use estimates and make corrections later
- List of colleges you are interested in attending. Make sure to include Allan Hancock College and Cuesta College among your choices
- Permanent resident or DACA card if you are not a U.S. Citizen
- Parents' date of birth
- Parents' date of marriage, divorce, separation, or widowed (if applicable)
- Parents' ITIN number for employment purposes (if applicable)

OPTIONAL:

- Driver's license or California ID
- Savings and checking account balances
- Bank statements
- Business records
- Records of untaxed income, such as child support received, interest income, and veteran's non-educational benefits

FOR INFORMATION ABOUT CAL GRANTS

- Your verified GPA is a must to get a Cal Grant. Public schools in California, including charters, must submit student GPAs to the commission. Check if your school sent your GPA. If not, download the form from www.csac.ca.gov/GPA.
- The form must be completed and signed by a school representative and submitted by March 2, 2020.

QUE TRAER AL TALLER CASH FOR COLLEGE:

- Número de Seguro Social del estudiante y de los padres (si se aplica)

- Una lista de los colegios a los que está interesado en asistir. Asegúrese de incluir a Allan Hancock College y a Cuesta College entre su selección
- Tarjeta de residente permanente o tarjeta de DACA en caso de no ser ciudadano estadounidense
- Fecha de nacimiento de los padres
- Fecha de matrimonio, divorcio o separación de los padres o información si son viudos (si se aplica)
- Numero de ITIN de los padres para propósitos de empleo (si se aplica)

OPCIONAL:

- Licencia de conducir de California o tarjeta de identificación
- Balances de cuentas de cheques o de ahorro
- Estados bancarios
- Comprobantes de negocios
- Comprobantes de ingresos libres de impuestos, como beneficios de asistencia pública recibidos, interés sobre ingresos y beneficios no educativos para veteranos

PARA INFORMACIÓN SOBRE CAL GRANTS

- Debe presentar su GPA para poder recibir una Cal Grant. Las escuelas públicas de California, incluyendo las escuelas 'charter' deben entregar a la comisión estudiantil, el GPA del estudiante. Revise si su escuela envió su GPA, si no lo han hecho, descargue el formulario en internet en www.csac.ca.gov/GPA.
- El formulario debe ser completado y firmado por un representante de su escuela y entregado a más tardar para el 2 de marzo del 2020.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Attend at least four of six years between grades 7 and 12 at a Santa Barbara County school and graduate or receive a GED from a Santa Barbara County high school by June*
- Plan to attend full time as a vocational, undergraduate, or graduate student at a Title IV-approved school
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or AB 540 eligible**

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Personal and Household Information – All Applicants

- Full legal name, personal email address, and contact information
- Citizenship status and social security number**
- Contact information of your closest family member or friend
- Financial and personal information for you and your parent(s) such as birthdate, employer, occupation, household size, and tax information

Required Documents – All Applicants

- Student Aid Report (SAR) generated by completing the FAFSA or California Dream Act Application
- College plan, including top college choices, proposed major, career goals, and expected graduation date
- Personal statement that includes your professional and academic goals, sources of motivation, and achievements
- List of activities, employment, community service, and honors or awards

Required Documents – New Applicants Only

- Transcripts from all high schools and colleges of attendance
- Undergraduate students (including high school seniors) must submit one academic letter of recommendation; a second letter of recommendation is optional.
- Graduate students must submit two letters of recommendation, one of which must be academic.

* Foster care youth, wards of S B County Court, and home-schooled or boarding school students, please call for eligibility. Homeschooled students must meet requirements for school affidavit(s)

** AB 540 students are not required to provide a social security number

Financial Aid Basics

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is funding from federal, state, institutional (colleges or universities), and private agencies intended to help students pay for educational expenses at colleges, universities, and vocational schools.

There are two applications for student aid, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the California Dream Act Application. Students should complete one application based on citizenship status.

U.S. CITIZENS, PERMANENT RESIDENTS & CERTAIN VISA HOLDERS

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
www.fafsa.ed.gov

- Available October 1; California state deadline is March 2.
- Completion is required to be considered for federal, state, institutional, and most private aid.
- Federal student aid includes grants, loans, and work-study programs.
- California state aid includes Cal Grants, the Chafee Grant for Foster Youth, Middle Class Scholarships, and other programs.
- Institutional aid varies by college.

Information needed to complete the FAFSA:

- Student and parent Federal Student Aid ID (fsaid.ed.gov)
- Student social security number and prior-prior year tax return and/or W2
- Parents' social security number (if applicable) and prior-prior year tax return(s) and/or W2
- Asset information
- Parents' birthdates, and date they were married/separated/divorced/widowed

UNDOCUMENTED & AB 540 ELIGIBLE*

- Available October 1; California state deadline is March 2.
- Completion is required to be considered for state, institutional, and most private aid.
- California state aid includes Cal Grants, the Chafee Grant for Foster Youth, Middle Class Scholarships, and other programs.
- Institutional aid varies by college.

Information needed to complete the California Dream Act Application:

- Student DACA number (if applicable)
- Student prior-prior year tax return and/or W2
- Parents' prior-prior year tax return(s) and/or W2
- Asset information
- Parents' birthdates, and date they were married/separated/divorced/widowed
