To Parents/Guardians,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your child’s school continues to be identified as a Program Improvement (PI) school under the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001. As such, you have the option to request SES (Supplemental Educational Services) or a NCLB transfer to a non-Program Improvement school.

**Public school choice: What right does a parent have to request a transfer to a school that is not in PI?**

All parents/guardians of students attending a PI school have the right to request a NCLB transfer of their child(ren) to a non-PI district school. For parents who select this option, the district may provide transportation to the non-PI school for as long as the home school continues to be identified as a PI school. If the home school exits PI by making AYP (Academic Yearly Progress) for two consecutive years, the student can remain at the school; however, transportation will no longer be district-paid. **If the demand for choice exceeds funds available, priority will be given to lowest achieving, low-income students.** If you are interested in transferring your child(ren) to a non-PI school in the district for the 2015-16 school year, please select from the following schools listed below. Your preference of a non-PI school will be taken into consideration.

To apply for a public school choice transfer from a PI school, please complete the NCLB Transfer application form available at your local school office, via the LUSD website at <http://www.lusd.org> or Education Center. Return the application to your child’s school or the Education Center at 1301 N. A Street by **3:30 p.m. on June 11, 2015**. **SES: How does a parent obtain a provider for their child?**

Students from families at continuing PI schools, whose parents did not select a public school choice option, and score basic or below on the most current SBAC (Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium) in math or ELA, are eligible for (SES). These services are classes or tutoring which occur outside the regular school day at sites off campus by educational providers approved by the State Board of Education. There are many benefits to your child(ren) receiving tutoring at no cost to you. After school educational services (provided by District teachers) may also be available at your child’s school.

- He/she receives specific help in English-language arts and or mathematics.
- The tutoring is provided beyond the regular school day.
- The tutoring is delivered in a one-to-one setting or in small groups.
- A student learning plan will address his/her specific academic needs.
- You, as the parent/guardian, will be consulted in developing your child’s learning plan.
- No transportation to and from tutoring off campus will be provided.

If you are interested in SES, please review the list of providers willing to serve the district’s students. The list identifies the subject area(s) and any special groups of students a provider is approved to serve. Information and the application are available at the Education Center, on LUSD web site at <http://www.lusd.org> or your child’s school office. Please complete and return the SES application form to the school site or the Education Center at 1301 N. A Street by **3:30 p.m. on June 11, 2015**. If you need assistance in making a selection of an SES provider(s) for your child(ren), please contact your child’s school principal.
