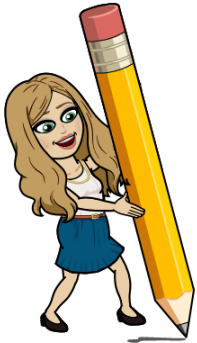

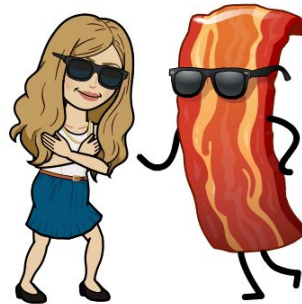

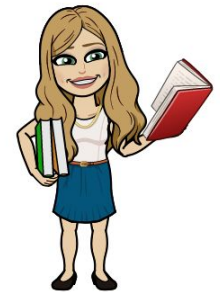

Connecting
activities/strategies to
Thinking Skill &
Practice

Teachers connect the activity to the specific thinking skills. This enables students to connect activities to a specific type of thinking. Students are then able to determine which tool would be the best to use when asked to "think critically." **Example:** Socratic Seminar -- Thinking skills are categorized as: Analyzing, Synthesizing, Evaluating, and Justifying. Teachers would need to make the connection between the *strategy* and *thinking skills* as students prepare and participate in Socratic Seminars.
